2006 Racing Season Scoring and Qualification

1. Scoring

As the SF IOD fleet has no officially documented season scoring system, we must use RRS A9, Race Scores in a Series Longer than a Regatta. This states:

For a series that is held over a period of time longer than a regatta, a boat that came to the starting area but did not start, did not finish, retired after finishing, or was disqualified shall be scored points for the finishing place one more than the number of boats that came to the starting area. A boat that did not come to the starting area shall be scored points for the finishing place one more than the number of boats entered in the series.

2. Qualification for 2006 International Events

Nantucket Invitational: The qualifying series shall consist of two WBRA race days (5/20 and 6/4), for a total of up to four races, with no throwouts.

2006 Worlds (LIS) and North American Invitational (BER): The qualifying series shall consist of two WBRA race days (5/20 and 6/4) and the Woodies Invitational, for a total of up to 9 races, with one throwout.

3. Qualification for 2007 International Events

Series: 5 WBRA race days (5/20, 6/4, 8/6, 8/26, 9/9), plus Woodies Invitational and Fall Classic (total of up to 19 races). The number of throwouts will be one plus an additional one for every six races completed (total of four expected)

Eligibility: In addition to eligibility provisions in SF IOD Fleet and WCA regulations, boats must start in at least half of the races of the qualifying series.

Selection order: The first place boat shall have first choice of event (2007 Worlds strongly encouraged), second place second choice, etc. If events remain once all eligible boats have selected, then the first place boat selects again, etc.

4. 2006 SF IOD Crew Cup

Series: 3 WBRA race days (4/29, 6/25, 8/12), up to six races, with one throwout.

Scoring: A boat's score will be reduced by the number of races helmed by a non-regular helmsperson, where a given helmsperson can qualify for a maximum of two bonus points (potential bonus of six points is available if three different non-regular helmspersons participate) Submit name of helmsperson(s) and race(s) helmed to vicechair@sfiod.org after each race day. A non-regular helmsperson is someone who has helmed an IOD for 5 races or less in the last 3 years.
